The End-of-Life Nursing Education Consortium (ELNEC) Project is a national end-of-life educational program administered by City of Hope and the American Association of Colleges of Nursing. The project is designed to enhance palliative care in nursing. The ELNEC Project was originally funded by a grant from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation with additional support from funding organizations (the National Cancer Institute, Aetna Foundation, Archstone Foundation, and the California Health Care Foundation).

Since 2001, 502 undergraduate nursing faculty, representing 460 (69%) baccalaureate nursing programs, and 300 graduate nursing faculty, representing 255 (58%) graduate schools of nursing from all 50 states and the District of Columbia have received ELNEC training.
