Dear Chairman Obey and Ranking Member Walsh:


We respectfully request that the Nursing Workforce Development programs (Title VIII of the Public Health Service Act) receive \$200 million in appropriations for FY 2009. Despite Congress' strong commitment to Title VIII funding in FY 2008, the President's FY 2009 budget proposal cut the programs by 30 percent from last year's funding level. Specifically, the Advanced Education Nursing (AEN) program, which supports programs that prepare graduate-level nurses to be primary care providers and nurse faculty, was eliminated. We believe a funding level of \$200 million is needed to maintain advanced education nursing programs, to invest in nursing education capacity, and to support programs that direct nurses into critical shortage areas.

For ten years, our nation has faced a nursing shortage unprecedented in its depth and duration. Unfortunately, it is expected to worsen in the coming years with the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) projecting that the nation's nursing shortage will grow to more than one million nurses by the year 2020. The current reality of the shortage was quantified by an April 2006 report published by the American Hospital Association, which states that U.S. hospitals need approximately 118,000 Registered Nurses to fill vacant positions nationwide. The nursing shortage is also impacting the military sector. In 2006, the Air Force, Army, and Navy experienced overall nurse vacancy rates of 15 percent, 8 percent, and 9.6 percent, respectively.


Further inhibiting the growth of the civilian and military nursing workforce is a significant shortage of nurse faculty. According to the American Association of Colleges of Nursing, schools of nursing turned away 42,866 qualified applicants to baccalaureate and graduate programs primarily due to insufficient numbers of faculty. This element of the shortage has created a negative chain reaction—without more nurse faculty additional nurses cannot be educated, and without more nurses, the shortage will continue.

Congress must invest more in the nursing workforce crisis because it is impacting the quality and safety of our healthcare system. The shortage is expected to place healthcare delivery in further jeopardy as the baby boomer population ages, medical technology advances, and the need for health care grows. Now is the time to invest in nursing. Your support for \$200 million in FY 2009 funding for Nursing Workforce Development programs will make a real difference in the lives of healthcare consumers, nurses, and the teachers committed to educating the nursing workforce's next generation.
