Licensed registered nurses applying to or enrolled in accredited schools of nursing.	<b>Master's Degree Scholarships in Cancer Nursing</b> <b>Annual Deadline: February 1</b>	Awarded to graduate students pursuing master's degrees in cancer nursing.	Awards are made for up to 2 years in the annual amount of \$10,000.
	Licensed registered nurses applying to or enrolled in accredited academic institution that can award a doctoral degree.	<b>Doctoral Degree Scholarships in Cancer Nursing</b> <b>New Deadline: October 15</b>	Awarded to graduate students pursuing doctoral study in the following cancer nursing fields: research, education, administration, or clinical practice.	Awards are made for up to 2 years with a stipend of \$15,000 per year. One renewal allowed.
	Postdoctoral fellows with 0-4 years fellowship experience at time of expected award.	<b>Postdoctoral Fellowships</b>	Supports 3 of any of first 5 years of postdoctoral fellowship.	1 to 3 year grants with progressive stipends of \$40,000, \$42,000, and \$44,000 per year, plus a \$4,000 per year institutional allowance.
	Junior clinical faculty within the first 4 years of faculty appointment.	<b>Mentored Research Scholar Grants in Applied and Clinical Research</b>	Supports mentored clinical, epidemiological, psychosocial, behavioral, health services, or health policy and outcomes research.	Awards are for up to 5 years and for a maximum of \$135,000 per year plus 8% allowable indirect costs. Up to \$10,000 for support of the mentor may be included in the budget.
	Investigators at any stage of their career.	<b>Research Scholar Grants in Cancer Control: Health Policy and Health Services Research</b>	Supports research projects in health services and health policy research.	Awards are for up to 4 years and for a maximum of \$200,000 per year, plus 20% allowable indirect costs.  <i>*Requests in excess of \$150,000 (direct costs) for basic or preclinical research require a detailed justification.</i>
	Investigators in the first six years of an independent research career or faculty appointment.	<b>Research Scholar Grants in Cancer Control: Psychosocial and Behavioral Research</b>	Supports research projects in cancer control, psychosocial, and behavioral research, including epidemiologic approaches to psychosocial and behavioral research.	
<b>Research Scholar Grants in Basic, Preclinical, Clinical, and Epidemiologic Research</b>		Supports research projects in basic, preclinical, clinical and epidemiologic research.*
